



For the past two semesters, students at Goldfarb have been spending their Thursday evenings out in the community at what they like to call, Wound Care Clinics. A local minister, Pastor Paul, began having these gatherings several years ago. Pastor Paul and his two brothers, all previously homeless, do everything they can to help those in need. They assist the homeless and less fortunate who attend the clinic by distributing food, clothing, and basic toiletries. After some time, Dr. Kathleen Thimsen, Goldfarb nursing instructor and certified wound ostomy care nurse, began taking students with her to help this specific patient population. Students make use of basic nursing skills, such as blood pressure checks, auscultation of heart and lungs sounds, cleansing and rebandaging wounds, and teaching patients how to maintain their health.


